I1. Sports Complex Request for Proposal Update

Economic Development Manager, Melissa McClain spoke about a memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the potential development of a Sports Park Complex in Moreno Valley.

I2. Special Events and Facilities

Claudia Torres shared several updates including the upcoming annual Juneteenth Celebration, scheduled for Friday, June 19th, from 6:00–10:00 p.m. at the Civic Center Amphitheater. The event will celebrate freedom, community, and family fun, featuring a variety of food vendors, live musical entertainment, interactive games, and activities for all ages.

The Conference and Recreation Center (CRC) continues to host community events and rentals, including Life Empowerment Church services on Sundays, the I.E. Black Woman's Collective event on June 28th in the Grand Valley Ballroom, and the Real Estate Conference on June 30th, also in the Grand Valley Ballroom.

In Sports, preparations are underway for the Summer Youth & Teen Basketball League, which begins in five weeks. Registration demand has been strong, and a waiting list is currently in place.

I3. Community Services

Nikki Hendricks shared updates on recent programs and events. The City hosted a successful MoVal Day at the Ballpark event on May 16 at Angel Stadium as the Angels took on the Dodgers. The event sold out, with all 30 tickets purchased by community members proudly representing Moreno Valley while enjoying an evening of baseball, community engagement, and family-friendly entertainment. Surveys have been sent out to obtain feedback from participants.

Summer aquatics programming will be offered at Valley View High School Pool from June 22 through August 1, 2026. Programming will include both structured swim lessons and recreational swim opportunities, providing residents with access to aquatic recreation and skill development during the summer months. The City of Moreno Valley has secured \$50,000 in grant funding from First 5 Riverside County to support early childhood swim lessons focused on drowning prevention and water safety for children ages five and under.

Highlights from our Afterschool Program, A Child's Place included staff development training, topics included behavior management, summer curriculum planning, health and safety procedures, and team building.

I4. Parks and Landscape Services

Dan Monto highlighted several completed projects including the landscape renovation around the splash pad at Bethune Park, the annual weed abatement of PCS owned parcels, resurfaced splash pad at Celebration Park, and tree trimmings at all the parks in need.

Projects underway include the trash receptacle replacement phase 3 in Zone A parks and trails and the landscape renovation in west parking lot of Morrison Park. The Park Rehabilitation and Refurbishment Program projects completed include epoxied the restroom floor at Weston Park, install new dugout shade covers at Towngate Park, install new windscreen on the baseball fields' outfield fence at March Field Park. Gateway Park Revitalization Project (Dog Park Addition) started in July 2025 and is anticipated to be completed by July 2026. Lakeshore Village Branch Library project began in February 2026. Contractor is currently installing electrical, plumbing, and HVAC mechanical.

I5. Administration and Financial Services

Jeremy Bubnick shared several updates, including progress on the search for the next Administration and Financial Services Division Manager, noting that several candidates have been interviewed. He also discussed the library's Zip Books patron-driven acquisition program for library materials.

City staff are preparing for the upcoming transition of the ASES and 21st CCLC grants to the Moreno Valley USD and Val Verde USD. Summer program at Edgemont Elementary School will not be supported due to limited facility space.
